

CARNEGIE MONEY IS READY

No More Delay Necessary Before Letting Contracts.

Word arrived Monday from the Carnegie corporation that everything was satisfactory with regard to the new \$10,000 Public Library, so arrangements will at once be made for starting the work at the earliest moment possible. M. R. Stauffer, who will personally superintend the work, was here Tuesday and signed up the contract, which aggregates \$8837 and includes the foundation and everything but plumbing and heating. Local workmen will be employed as far as possible.

Removal of library books to the city building began today, the G. A. R. being temporarily accommodated up stairs. On Saturday evening the township board will decide what is to be done with the old library building, for which some private bids have been received. On Monday it will doubtless be moved.
